Definition: The quality or state of being able to do something; the capacity or skill to do something.

Synonyms: Capability, capacity, competence, power, skill, talent.

Antonyms: Disability, incapability, ineptitude, powerlessness, weakness.

**Absorb:**

Definition: To take in or soak up a substance or information; to assimilate or comprehend something fully.

Synonyms: Assimilate, consume, imbibe, learn, take in, understand.

Antonyms: Disperse, emit, expel, reject, repel.

**Abundant:**

Definition: Existing or available in large quantities; plentiful; ample.

Synonyms: Copious, generous, plentiful, profuse, rich, substantial.

**Accuse:**

Definition: To charge someone with a crime or wrongdoing; to blame or criticize someone for something.
